

- Nicknamed "Remain in Mexico"; the Migrant Protection Protocol doesn't protect migrants.
- Allows migrants to ask for asylum, but they are sent to Mexico to await court.
- Wait in tent camps or temporary shelters for six months to a year, or more.
- Began in 2019 by Trump admin.
- Biden tried to end it; courts upheld the policy.
- SCOTUS set to hear the case end of April 2022.

Both are inhumane: leaving asylum seekers to fend for themselves, in great danger and at risk of kidnapping, rape, extortion and murder.

Fellowship



- A CDC policy that is invoked to protect public health.
- Prevents migrants from declaring asylum at ports of entry (an international human right).
- Immediately expels migrants to Mexico or elsewhere.
- Began in April 2020.
- Biden continued the practice, except for unaccompanied minors.
- Health experts admit it doesn't protect U.S. from COVID.
- Set to expire May 23, 2022.
